The Swiss association *Förderverein "Kinder der Zukunft"* (*Children of the Future*) is a non-profit organization based in Neuheim, Switzerland, that maintains political and religious neutrality, as outlined in Art—60 ff. of the Swiss Civil Code (ZGB).

The association aims to provide financial and conceptual assistance to its Peruvian partner, *Asociación Niños del Porvenir* in Huancayo, Peru, for planning and executing projects that benefit socially disadvantaged children. Funding comes from membership fees, donations, sponsorships, and proceeds from different campaigns and events.

The association 'Children of the Future (Förderverein Kinder der Zukunft)' was officially founded on 23 September 2008 in Neuheim (Zug) and has been recognised as a non-profit association since February 2011.

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Approximately 100 children from underprivileged backgrounds receive free education at Yachay Primary School. Alongside their studies, these students take on small jobs to help their parents, most of whom lack stable employment. In addition to traditional curriculum subjects, the school provides targeted support in handicrafts, home economics, IT, and English.

The teachers support children in their personal development. By fostering numerous positive self-esteem experiences within a nurturing and supportive environment, students are empowered to pursue their independence and autonomy. The school provides a safe environment, where the children can learn peacefully, set aside their worries, and find respite from the challenges of everyday life.

Teaching values and raising awareness of children's rights are important in the educational process. The children from disadvantaged families are encouraged to know their rights and take on an active role in society.



The lessons in the 'Taller productivo' are very popular with the children.

The school classrooms and the inner courtyard are also available to the local community of Ocopilla for their projects and other educational events.
